HEALTH WARRANTY ON ADOPTED ANIMALS

The uMngeni SPCA endeavours to ensure that all animals that leave its facility are in good health. Occasionally, due to the trauma of adjusting to a new home, a latent condition may manifest itself shortly after the animal has been adopted.

The uMngeni SPCA undertakes to give free veterinary treatment to any animal adopted from the Society for a period of 14 days, effective from the date the animal leaves its facility, on condition that:-

- The SPCA veterinarian, or other approved veterinarian, confirms that the animal is suffering from a disease or medical condition acquired before going to its new home.
- The animal must receive the treatment or action recommended by the above mentioned veterinarian.

Please note that Veterinary treatment for any injuries, illness or diseases contracted after leaving the SPCA will be the responsibility of the new owner as will the animal's annual booster vaccinations.
